The movie "Finding Nemo" has had people going crazy over clownfish. The clownfish is found in the sea and comprises about 30 different species. These fish are very colourful and range from yellow to maroon. The most common is a bright orange intermingled with white stripes which was the specie depicted in the movie.

The most common home for the clownfish is among the tentacles of the sea anemone. The clownfish is able to live without getting stung by the anemone and actually uses the anemone to save itself from predators. The fish continuously loops through the waving tentacles. The clownfish develops a kind of slimy covering around its body that helps it to withstand the anemone's stings.

The clownfish is dependent on the anemone for food. After the anemone paralyses and eats a fish, the clownfish will polish off the remaining uneaten parts. In return, the clownfish helps to keep the anemone free of dead tentacles by eating them. The clownfish also helps the anemone get food by using its bright colouration to lure unsuspecting fish into its vicinity. This special relationship with the anemone makes the clownfish one of the most curious creatures living in water.

Far too small to be hunted by man for food, the clownfish have lived undisturbed in the coral reefs for thousands of years. However, recently, they have become as popular as other saltwater aquarium fish. The brightly-coloured species fetch a high price in Europe and the United States. Collectors have destroyed many reefs, often damaging or killing the host anemones in the process.

Fortunately, many local governments have laws that restrict the number of clownfish that can be taken from their habitats and the manner by which they can be taken. As clownfish is a big attraction with snorkellers and scuba divers, the tourist industry has tried to protect them and ensure that they live and breed safely on the reefs.
