The National Spelling Whiz 2021 is open to Primary 4, 5 and 6 pupils in Singapore. It aims to help them appreciate the importance of spelling. Do you have tenacity, grit and resilience? If your answer is yes, then you must sign up!

In the competition, pupils will use various strategies to spell many different words both familiar and unfamiliar to them.

FORMAT OF COMPETITION

Preliminary Round (3 June 2021, 10 a.m. at Expo City)

Participants are required to take a 40-minute written test. A list of 50 words will be read out to them and they have to spell them out on paper. The top 80 participants will move on to the Semi-Final Round

Semi-Final Round (10 June 2021, 2 p.m. at Expo City)

The Semi-Final Round will take place on stage. Words will be read out and participants will take turns to spell them aloud. Each participant is given a time limit of 1 minute to spell the word correctly. Participants who are unable to do so will be eliminated. The elimination process will continue until the top 10 participants emerge. They will compete in the Grand Final.

Grand Final (22 June 2021, 10 a.m. at University of Singapore)

The format of the Grand Final will be similar to the Semi-Final. Each participant will be given a list of 40 challenging words to spell aloud. They have to memorise these words and will be given 10 minutes to do so. Finalists are encouraged to recite these words to a friend before the actual test begins. The actual test will last for 4 minutes. The student who spells the most number of words correctly within 4 minutes will emerge as champion.

companies after they have done or said something that is considered wrong or offensive. When
51) is 'cancelled', it is deleted, ended or voided. This is the basic (52)

discovered that they have done something "wrong" or "unacceptable" based on the opinions of others.
There is also a general process to 'cancel culture'. Firstly, evidence of someone, saying or doing
something "wrong" is surfaced. (55) this information is spread online. Finally, netizens call
for the person's 'cancellation'. This involves calling out the bad behaviour, (58)support
for his or her work, such as by not being a follower online or not "liking" their posts or content. In extreme
cases, it involves even putting up "hate" messages on one's own social media to (57)
