Without any warning, a small car flew across the central divider from the opposite direction and crashed into my car head-on. I passed out on the spot. Then my phone rang, and it awakened me. My travel agent had called, asking me if I had arrived for my assignment. Before I could answer, I lost consciousness again.

I was brought to Kuala Lumpur General Hospital, bleeding profusely. I tried not to look at my crushed leg hanging limply from my body, blue and lifeless. I pleaded with the doctors to save my leg, no matter the cost and they calmiy promised me that they would try their best.

Three months later, I was discharged and given ten months of medical leave. My heart sank as that meant I could not work as a freelance tour guide. Without any income, I wondered how I could support myself and my mother. I felt utterly hopeless but was thankful that my friends and relatives would visit me whenever they could to cheer me up.

I was only 30 and I wanted to see the world. Not wanting to be stuck in a wheelchair for life, I did not let the sight of my frail legs discourage me. I worked hard at my physiotherapy, with one aim — I must walk again. After five months of gruelling therapy sessions, I was back on my feet. It took me another eight months to walk without the aid of crutches. By February the following year, I was travelling around the world again. Today, eight years after the accident, I still have pain in my leg but I will persevere and not let it interfere with my work.

The accident made me realise how life can change in a split second. It also taught me to be thankful. 5 out of the 6 people in the overcrowded car that crashed into mine lost their lives instantly. I am thankful to the two motorcyclists who wrapped their jackets around their arms and removed the shattered windscreen to rescue me. I am also grateful to the Chinese family that readily overlooked taboo and drove me to the hospital despite my bloodled condition on Chinese New Year. The kindness I experienced taught me never to give up hope on anyone or in any situation. I will pay it forward and help anyone in need because now I know the struggles of losing one's independence.


