

She would squawk, flap her wings and peck at me if she did not like something I was doing. I would sprinkle grain for her and she began to tolerate me because of it.

However, on the day I named her, she did not seem to have any toleration for me at all. I had gone into the barn to get grain for the horses when she flew at me, pecking and squawking. I shooed her away, yelling, "Get away, you psycho fluff ball!" That was how she got her name Fluff which was short for Psycho Fluff Ball. It was a week after the attack that I learned the reason it had occurred. She was trying to chase every leaf or creature out of the barn and that was when I heard some chirping sounds coming from a dark corner of the barn. Despite her acts of intimidation, curiosity got the better of me and I inched closer to find little fluffy bundles of about every imaginable colour.

Sadiy, one day, they just disappeared but not without a trail of feathers. I knew the animal which had taken Fluff's chicks must have put up a fight because Fluff lost a lot of feathers. By the time Fluff was once again in her protective mood, most of her feathers had grown back. I discovered another nest of eggs in the corner of the barn and when I saw part of a beak poking out of one, I rushed home to get my family. Fluff was beginning to trust me, but other humans still made her nervous. However, she let us get within five feet before she squawked her warning. Within a few days, there was a brood of chicks for her to protect.

Then, one day, as I was cleaning the stallion's stall in another barn, Fluff came squawking and pecking at my feet. I pushed her away with my foot. "Get away, Fluffi" She attacked again and then ran toward the other barn, flapping and squawking. I went back to my work, and she attacked me again, only to run back toward her barn, flapping, squawking and turning in circles. I thought, "You want me
