Section G: Comprehension 1 (8 marks)

Read the passage carefully and answer the questions 35 to 41.

The Venus Flytrap is a plant that traps and eats insects. It belongs to a group of carnivorous or meat-eating plants. This group also includes sundews and pitcher plants. The scientific name of the Venus Flytrap is *Dionaea muscipula*. In the wild, the Venus Flytrap grows only in some parts of North and South Carolina, United States. It grows best in soil that is moist.

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The Venus Flytrap is a small plant that grows from a bulblike root. It reaches a height of between 20 and 30 centimetres and produces small, white flowers. The leaves of the plant grow in rounded halves. The halves are hinged together on one side like jaws. Each half has long spikes along its edge and three hairs on top that are sensitive to touch. The leaf oozes out a sticky substance that attracts flies and other insects.

When an insect crawls between the two halves of a leaf, the hairs detect its presence. Within seconds, the leaf snaps shut and the long spikes lock the insect together. Once the insect is trapped, the leaf releases enzymes, or digestive juices. These juices break down the insect into nutrients. The leaf absorbs the nutrients for the plants. The leaf then transports these nutrients to all parts of the plant. This process takes about ten days. The leaf then reopens and is ready for the next meal.
