Weekly Nature Feature: Our Beloved Busy Bees

Bees are fascinating insects that play a crucial role in our environment!

Read on to find out more about them!

The Life of Bees

Bees live in interesting communities. In every hive, there are three types of bees: the queen, the drones and the workers. The queen is the only female bee that lays eggs. The drones are male bees that mate with the queen. The workers are all female and seem to be responsible for everything — they build the hive, collect nectar, make honey and take care of the young bees.



The Importance of Bees

Bees are responsible for pollinating many of the plants we rely on for food, ensuring that the plants are able to reproduce. Without bees, our supply of countless fruits, vegetables and nuts may run out one day. In addition to pollination, bees produce honey, beeswax and royal jelly, which are used for diverse purposes. Honey is a natural sweetener that is good for health. Beeswax is used in cosmetics and candles. Royal jelly is a popular ingredient in beauty and health products as it is believed to offer antiageing benefits and boost the immune system. As you can see, bees are extremely important for the environment and human survival.




The Threats to Bees


Unfortunately, climate change, habitat destruction and chemical use are the main threats bees face. To protect them, we can plant bee-friendly plants in our gardens, support local beekeepers and reduce our use of pesticides.



How Honey is Made


Bees leave their hives in search of flowers and use their long tongue, which works like a straw, to suck a sugary juice called nectar out of the flowers. The nectar is stored in a second stomach – known as the honey stomach.





After filling their second stomach, the bees will return to their hive and pass the nectar through their mouths to other bees. Those bees will chew on the nectar for about thirty minutes and pass it to another bee. As the nectar is passed from bee to bee, it is turned into honey.

Once the nectar becomes honey, the bees will store it in honeycomb cells, which are like little jars made of wax. The bees then flap their wings over the honey, fanning it to assist the evaporation of excess water and make it thicker like syrup. Once the honey is ready, the bees will seal the cells using wax lids.



At this point, skilled beekeepers can take the finished honey from the hive, taking care not to disturb the colony or damage the hive.


