At 18, he started work at an art studio, only to get fired from his job as his bosses felt that he lacked imagination. His businesses constantly failed due to a lack of money. His first animation series, *Alice in Wonderland*, was rejected many times before it was finally accepted by a cartoon distributor.

However, the cartoon distributor eventually tricked Walt and stole his second successful animation character, Oswald the Lucky Rabbit. Walt was disheartened and frustrated. However, it was during this difficult time that Walt created his most famous character to date: Mickey Mouse. Mickey was the star of Walt's first sound cartoon and it was a hit!

Six years later, Walt took up the challenge of creating his first full-length film, Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs. Everyone thought it was a terrible idea but Walt persevered and it became the most popular film in 1937!
