These are the ingredients:

- one-quarter cup of rabbit pellets (small hard balls of hay);
- half cup of hay dust;
- one banana; and
- sixteen raisins.

We got two cardboard tubes to make the 'wheels'.

First, we preheated the oven. Next, we made the dough. Sister crushed the pellets and sprinkled water to soften them, while I mashed the banana. Then we put them together in a bowl and mixed in the hay dust. Afterwards, we cut the cardboard tubes into rings, each about two centimetres thick. We arranged them on a baking tray. Carefully, we added the dough to each cardboard ring before placing a raisin at the centre of each 'wheel'. Lastly, we put the tray of treats into the oven for twenty minutes.

You know something? The aroma of baked banana and hay was mouth-watering! When I exclaimed that Boba was one lucky bunny, Sister dared me to try some. How annoying! Anyway, Boba loved the raisin wheels! She also had fun trying to get the treats out of the rings. My homemade treats are the best!
