We like to use disposable cutlery, cups and plates. Instead of cooking, we tend to order takeout that comes in containers. We buy drinks in bottles, and snacks in bags. We purchase clothes with little consideration. Focusing on our wants and convenience, we ignore the impact of our actions.

When we throw these items away, they do not simply disappear. Rather, they often end up in streets, parks, landfills and oceans. Over time, plastics that make up these items break down into tiny pieces called microplastics. These microplastics are so tiny that they are hard to see with the naked eye, causing big problems for organisms.

When rain washes these microplastics into water bodies, like rivers and wells, the water becomes unsafe for drinking for both humans and animals. When they enter oceans, sea creatures mistake them for food and eat them. These animals can get very sick and even die.

There are many ways to reduce plastic usage to protect our world from the harmful effects of microplastics. One way is to minimise the use of disposable items. For example, we can use a refillable water bottle, carry tote bags for shopping, pack snacks in reusable containers and avoid using plastic tableware. Eating home-cooked meals rather than takeout is another way to reduce plastics by minimising packaging waste.
