The trail goes through a dense forest which stretches for nearly 30 kilometres. By taking a walk along the nature trail, hikers get to enjoy the beautiful views of the towering trees. Hikers might also spot wildlife such as boars and hedgehogs.

Nonetheless, this relatively unknown area has several potential safety hazards especially to hikers not familiar with the terrain. Poisonous insects and plants may exist within the difficult terrain comprising steep hills and rocky paths. When rain falls, hikers have to be careful and watch out for slippery grounds. Furthermore, its remote location will pose a challenge for hikers in an emergency. They may not be able to use their phones for navigation and communication in certain parts of the forest as the signal is not strong enough.
