To me, Grandma was like **a wizard in the kitchen**. Spinning her "magic" over bubbling pots and pans, she could whip up delicious meals for the family effortlessly. Since I thought I had a talent for cooking, I asked her to teach me. Sensing my enthusiasm to learn, she accepted my request **readily**.

I could not wait to get on with **the exciting bit** immediately. As I reached out for a wooden spoon, Grandma's gaze froze me in place. She cautioned, "Cooking is fun, but it's important to put safety first, especially when fire is involved."

While Grandma was warning me to be careful around open fires, I was playing with the wooden spoon and knocked over a pan with sizzling oil. In the nick of time, she yanked me aside as the pan crashed to the ground. **Furious** with what had happened, Grandma lashed out at me instantly, "Jim, get out of my kitchen until you are more serious about learning!"

Feeling upset with my **punishment**, I stormed out of the kitchen. "What's so difficult about cooking? I'll learn it myself...one day!" I scoffed. Grandma shook her head in disappointment. "It's just a trivial mistake, but she had to blow it out of proportion! I can learn to cook on my own, even if it is through trial and error," I muttered, sounding a little arrogant.

One morning, Grandma left me some money for lunch as she had gone out with her friends. Having the kitchen all to myself, I seized the opportunity to cook my own meal. Things started off well as I was able to locate her recipe book in a corner of her drawer easily. Having watched Grandma numerous times, I was certain that I would be able to cook like her.

Determined to prove my cooking skills, I stood at the stove and attempted to fry noodles for the first time. I heated the oil in the pan, not realising it had gotten too hot. As I dropped the noodles in, they sizzled and sent splatters of hot oil flying in all directions! Some scalded my arm, making me yelp in excruciating pain. However, I ignored it and bravely continued, not willing to end my cooking experience in failure.

I gritted my teeth and tried to stir the noodles clumsily with a wooden spoon, but that only made things worse. The noodles became entangled and began to burn. A few pieces even flew out of the pan. I decided to soften the sticky mass with water. To my horror, smoke started to fill the kitchen. The pungent smell of charred food filled the air and made me cough. Panicking, I accidentally knocked over a bottle of soy sauce, which spilled across the counter, adding to the mess. By the time I finally turned off the stove, there were oil splatters, burnt noodles and sticky puddles of soy sauce everywhere. My cooking experience had ended in a disaster. I grabbed a sponge and started scrubbing the burnt remnants from the pan dejectedly.

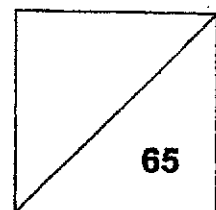
