

The extract below is from a talk on 'How to be a Responsible Pet Owner'.

Dogs do not need to be bathed as often as humans do. Puppies should be washed every one to two weeks. If they have long hair, regular brushing is important to keep their coats clean and tangle-free. If their nails grow too long, use nail clippers to trim them and keep them comfortable.

Puppies need to be taught where to go to relieve themselves at home. Use a training mat to help them know which spot to use. The training can be done at home or at puppy preschool.

Puppies need proper dental care. Regular dental check-ups and cleaning help prevent plaque buildup. Brush your puppy's teeth at least two to three times a week.

Puppies love to sleep. Make sure they have a bed that feels safe and secure, with something soft and comfortable to snuggle into.

Puppies are full of energy. To prevent bad habits like chewing on shoes, keep them entertained with a variety of toys to play with regularly.

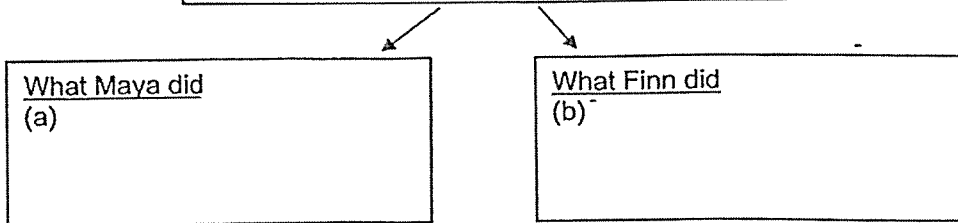
